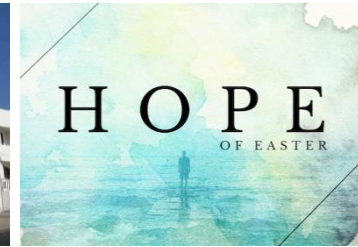

## MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAPLAIN

Dear friends,

The one wonderful thing about these past months has been how we have managed to use technology to link across the miles. For the clergy in our Diocese (all of Europe), we have formed an incredible bond, and also via a wide variety of media platforms we have engaged with one another in the most wonderful way.

One example is that we have the most committed member of the Mothers' Union, Jenny Hand, who will not stop knitting – and sending gifts from her home in the UK – for children and particularly babies here on Lanzarote.

She retains her membership of the MU in Lanzarote.

Today an Easter message was received from Susan and Victor Fleming in Kilkenny in Ireland saying that they are determined to be back among us in September.

I write this on the evening of Good Friday. A day when we had hoped to have been able to share ecumenically with the 'Way of the Cross' around the harbour side in Puerto del Carmen. Sadly, that couldn't take place because of the restrictions but thankfully we were able to have a small but meaningful gathering at the foot of the cross in church. The readings from John's Gospel told the story and beautiful hymns and worship songs enhanced the experience in such a meaningful liturgy.

Now we have the emptiness as we wait for that glorious Easter experience.

Robert, our Diocesan Bishop, based in Brussels, has asked us to share his message for this Eastertide. Here is an extract:

***Easter Sunday finds us this year in hard times. Yet, dear friends, the message of Easter is exactly the message we need to hear. For as we gaze on the face of Christ we can be reassured that the earthly Jesus has shared fully in the worst that life can throw at any of us. We can draw renewed confidence that in Jesus God triumphs over the forces of darkness and provides us with a secure basis for faith and a sure ground for hope. We can truly know that God walks with us through the storms of life, and that we can dream new dreams and imagine new futures within the purposes of a God who brings life out of death and joy out of despair.***

So, let us pray that we will continue to proclaim the good news of the risen Christ as we seek to serve and support our neighbours.

We send an invitation to you all to come and worship with us this Eastertide.

If you cannot physically be with us on Lanzarote – then come to the 'Church without walls' and enjoy sharing with us in our Living Room Services. You don't have to book a seat or even take a test – just come as you are!! A seat by the fire awaits you – and if you sit close enough, I am sure you will get warm.
